into that category," Marshall said.

"And, it would be tough to get anyone who had around 50 workers to locate in that area. Since the dump is right there behind it and the plot of land is located closely also.

"When you look at it you can see there exists an infrastructure, meaning there are sewer or water lines which reach that far. You're talking about a lot of money when you talk about getting lines to reach up that hill."

Danny Hughes, magistrate, asked Hart if he had been quoted any prices.

"The only thing we told him was an acre, according to the state, would be in the area of \$10,000. But this is all between you and him now," Marshall said.

Nicholas County Judge - Executive Charles Smith is concerned the acre came close to monitoring wells at the landfill. "I think you can't build any-

thing within 200 feet of those wells. We don't want to get the state to here on those landfills, we've had enough trouble with those already. That's something we will have to check on," Judge Smith said.

"And he is offering a service to the community. If we do everything by the book according to staying away from those wells I don't see any problem with selling him an acre," Hughes said.

"I don't think we have to sell it, but if we did, \$10,000 seems really cheap. I think it's worth more than that," Stacy said.

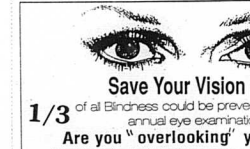
"You should know I've got an option on land on the bypass in Paris for \$15,000 an acre, and I
