The Academy member is required to obtain a specific number of points through completion of recognized institute or college courses, completion of seminars and workshops offered by other professional meetings and conferences, and honors and awards received for specific achievements.

Presently less than 7% of the 10,000 members of the International Institute of Municipal Clerks have qualified for the

Academy status. IMC President Norma S. Rodgers, CMC/AAE, City Clerk of San Antonio, Texas, announced, "I am honored to welcome Mrs. Tapp as a member in the SECOND SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP of the IMC Academy for advanced Education. She has demonstrated and obtained career development goals that will aid her in maintaining the quality of excellence that is required of today's public officials and administrators."

Mrs. Tapp has served as City Clerk-Treasurer with the City of Carlisle since June 1979. She received her professional certification - the IMC Certified Municipal Clerk's Award - in 1984. In January 1986, she was accepted as the second Clerk from the State of Kentucky, and the 221st member in the Academy for Advanced Education. This marks her second entry of Sustaining Membership in the Academy and she has been certified to 1997.
