would cost \$134,000. "We know the money is available if you as a board are ending with an excess amount of money. That money should be invested. Not held on salaries and facilities for students."

A teacher for 25 years, Simons said an increase would bring back the good teachers that are being lost to other counties and counties. Higher salaries and better facilities would turn that around, he claimed.

Simons ended his discussion by stating that county governments are in a trend of merging and that the next thing to merge might be county schools. "Before long, there'd be talk of merging our high school with other high schools and there wouldn't be any Nicholas County High School. Now is the time, and I'm speaking to the board, to push Nicholas County High School to a firm stand and approve salaries and facilities. They are here through the KERA Act. The salaries and buildings would be paid for now and through the future."

The audience applauded each teacher as the presentation ended. The meeting went quickly, lasting a little less than two hours.

The names of 30 certified personnel of the school district were listed on the board agenda with Crout, Green and Simons speaking before the board. Also listed on the agenda were Karla Allison, Betty Ballard, Doug Bechanson, Elizabeth Collins, Lisa Gonn, Sandra Durbin, Karen Gilbert, James Hamm, Herb Hill, Jack Hayes, Travis Huber, Mike Kenney, Sue Kirby, James Lally, Greg Lopez, Anita Litterer, Pat Mason, Chris O'Hearn, Bonnie Metcalfe, Catherine Sagaves, Danny Tackitt, Martha Taylor, David Walshaw, Leslie Brewer, Bob Baker, Greg Reid and Nida Fryman.

School Board Chairman Lester Zachary said the meeting of March 15 in a telephone interview that it is unlikely the high school teachers request for an increase would be on the next meeting agenda since the elementary school teachers would like to meet. High school teachers met the 10-day request to be on the board agenda and the elementary teacher's will most likely ask to be on the agenda in April.

Before a decision could be made regarding the increase, the board would need to review state salaries. "The state's not set guidelines about what the salaries are, if there is any increase this year," Zachary said.

An announcement on salaries may be made by the state from mid to late April. School board member John Cleaver Jr. said KERA funded a 10 percent salary increase in 1993 and a five percent increase in 1992. For 1993, an increase was given by the state, although some districts typically gave a one to three percent increase. Some districts gave no increase that year. Nicholas County teachers received a two percent increase.

After the teachers talked, Senior Class President Anne Farah brought up the non-renewal of Superintendent Robert Gilbert's contract. She asked the board if the reason for non-renewal was that a bus garage was constructed as one of the first things Gilbert done by board recommendation four years ago when he was hired. "We all deserve a better reason. The bus garage was approved by the board. If that's not why he was dismissed tell us. We're just trying to look to you, to feel confident in your future plans. You're hiding behind a law that protects you but leaves no room for suspicion."

The board has not given an official reason as for Gilbert's non-renewal, nor are they mandated by law to give a reason to the public.

Individual members have expressed apprehension in giving a public reason.

Board member John Cleaver Jr. said shortly after the meeting on Tuesday, March 15, that the voters want "People, through phone calls or letters, talk with us. A lot don't want to speak in public. They want the board members to do that. I think that's what people in this case have done."

Cleaver, a board member for 10 years, also said that it was

not likely that Gilbert's contract could be renewed at this point. The screening process to look at superintendent candidates has been started. Committee members were announced at the March board meeting.

"If the right procedure here has been followed concerning Mr. Gilbert's contract," Cleaver said.

Senior Laura Hamm addressed the board by commenting that Mr. Gilbert's family is all involved in the school system. His wife is a home economics teacher. His children, John and

Candace are both high school students. Candace will be a senior in the fall. The Gilbert family attends a local church. "He and his family are an asset to this community and that's why I'm so concerned with his non-renewal."

Dorothy Fryman, a board member for five months until last fall, pressed citizens for the good turnout. "Regardless of which side you're on, it's great you're here. I'd like to see this kind of support all the time and have meetings held here (at the elementary school). As a parent
