Efficient Cooling Equipment Saves Money, Environment

Although once a home luxury, central air conditioning is now considered essential here as well as in many other parts of the United States. The American home has either central air conditioning or heat pumps, according to the Edison Electric Institute and the National Electrical Cooperative Association, two national associations of electrical utilities.

Conducting an energy audit of the home is a worthwhile practice, getting the most out of every kilowatt-hour of electricity used. Here are some important electricity-saving tips to follow when using your central air conditioning system:

- Changing the air conditioner's filters every month or two, depending on how dirty they are. You should be able to see light rays through the filter. If not, it is dirty.
- Properly weatherproof your home. Weatherstripping doors and windows, and adding attic insulation, if necessary, keeps the heat outside.
- Consider home improvements such as installing reflecting glass windows, double-pane windows, and awnings to reduce heat gain from the sun.
- During the day, keep curtains drawn and shades pulled over.

High-Tech Windows Lower Energy Bills

Windows with heat from your home in the winter, and coolness in the summer, are the most energy-efficient gainers—through windows, than any other part of the home. According to the National Electrical Cooperative Association, two national associations of electrical utilities, a window is a particularly important part of the home's energy efficiency program. The most energy-efficient window is a double-pane glass (R-value of approximately 1.0) multiple-pane window. Using such a window in a window well will add a multiple-pane window, use with either two or three panes of glass, will raise the window's R-value approximately 1.0 for each additional pane of glass used.

Using a gas burner that consumes as much as argon or carbon dioxide, between the panes of glass, is another effective way to save conductive transfer of heat in multi-pane windows.
