Lady Jackets down Montgomery to hold on to title

CYNTHIANA — Although Montgomery County came after the Region 10 title with a vengeance, the Nicholas County Lady Jackets overcame an experienced foe, bringing home a victory, once again, for Nicholas County.

Kim Denkins opened scoring for Nicholas, sending home the definitive basket even though she was tripped teamed in the point by Meredith Burton, Amy Hall and Nona Townsend.

Although Denkins put on a great performance, Kerry Morris went two for two at the line to slow the Lady Jackets' momentum.

Hall, in an effort to shut down Nicholas penetration, fouled Denkins and the striped in another two points at the stripe.

George took home the basket on the next play, but after Hall snagged her own rebound and scored on the put-back, Nicholas called time out.

Back in play, Montgomery County was plagued by turn-

overs, walking to the basket, and three key free ball game passes as Nicholas turned up the heat on defense.

On the Nicholas County offensive end, Denkins hit Livingston on the weak side wing for the device. Denkins turned around and hit one of her own to cut the Lady Indians lead to three.

Vice and Burton came right back to trip a couple of baskets through the back door, but Sibert landed a three point goal to cut the Lady Indians lead to 11 points.

Denkins closed out the third quarter and out the opposition lead to nine, 53-44.

Hopkins popped out with the rim shot, opening the fourth quarter and proving that Jim Valvano saying rings true on the high school court as well. "Don't ever count us out."

Denkins two hit home from the foul line and fans had to say "Hoops, there the 'it' as we point lead through to five. And in the blink of an eye, Hopkins tied it up, 52 all with 6:04 to play.

Sibert hit home at the foul line, moving the Lady Jackets into ahead of the Lady Indians by two. But Vice pulled one out under pressure to break even with Nicholas County. However, Nicholas couldn't quite cement the lead, and after Burton and Hall battered away two Lady Jacket passes, Montgomery went back up by six points, 61-55.

But let's reiterate - don't count all the Lady Jackets just yet.

With 2:30 left, Denkins secured her own rebound, scored on the put back, and then was assisted by Schandling to sink in another one.

Livingood snugged a no-nonsense rebound and put back the basket. When she followed up with two shots from the line, Nicholas trailed by only one 66-65.

Burton answered by driving home a lay-up, but Denkins rallied Nicholas County by taking it despite three Lady Indians on her jersey.

With 38 seconds left, Nicholas trailed by two. As the clock ticked down to 22, George found her mark and hit home. But George fouled Hall and Hall went to knock down the front end of the worst way.

Although Carissa Skinner jumped right back on the return, Livingood handed Nicholas the lead, 68-66.

The Lady Jackets would follow up with nine more unanswered points to halve the overtime overtures - 77-66, advancing to the finals with Montgomery County.

In the scoring area, Denkins led with 32 points, Hopkins followed with 22, Sibert had 10, Livingston, seven, Schandling, four and George had two points.

After Kennedy landed a shot, Nicholas County called time out. Vaughn fouled Sibert yet again, with 13 seconds left to play, and she went one for two at the line, 49-47.

But Hall answered by tying it up, 49 all - first overtime. Hopkins drew a foul on Hall and went two for two.

With the clock winding down to 48 seconds, Clark County made a desperate attempt for possession - and displayed a saddening amount of poor sportsmanship - as Akinson hit Denkins directly in the face and committed a foul.

Denkins - unruffled by the incredible amount of pressure - knocked down both free throws. With 13 seconds to play, Vaughn led her team into a second overtime, by going straight to the basket for the first - 69 points all.

At the opening of the second

overtime, Sibert swished one from the corner, but on the return, Kim Shoemaker handed off to Vaughn for the backdoor entrance and the basket.

With 1:27 to play, Wilson sank a try from the top spot and Clark went up 62-61.

But it was cudos back to Denkins who tied it up with a falling, well maybe just on the floor shot, 64 all - yes, really, a third overtime.

Hopkins popped out in the first overtime with a baseline, 360 degree shot that hit home in
