"It means more lab time, more hands on experience for our students. It is useful in a lot of classes and not as good in other situations," said high school principal Greg Reid. Since the item dealt with curriculum, the board of education would have to approve the measure, Reid said.

The court announced the layoff of three county road workers effective July 1. The layoffs were a way to save money for asphalt. The salaries of the workers will amount to approximately \$40,000 added to the road fund. A total of \$22,000 is owed to the rock quarry from people picking up rock at the quarry and not paying when billed. "That's not as much as I first thought," commented Magistrate Cheryl Stacy about the money owed for rock. To help make up for the loss of revenue that will occur when the rock is no longer being crushed at the quarry, the fiscal court hopes to stockpile rock. The rock would be for county road use. The court would also like to sell rock on a cash up front basis. However, prices to sell the rock were not discussed. The next meeting of the fiscal court was a 9 a.m. Tuesday, May 10.
