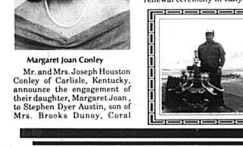

Dr. Carl Rosen talks about...

Family Urology

(Part 2 of 3) QUESTION: We talked about urology in our last conversation strictly concerning prostate trouble in older men. Urology is important to all ages and both genders, isn't it?

- ANSWER: Yes. Prostate trouble in younger men often takes the form of prostatic enlargement.
Q: Curable with antibiotics?
A: Not really curable, and hard to eradicate because of all the diets and structures in the prostate.
Q: What causes prostatitis?
A: Much of it is sexually related. Patients tend to have it as a constant occurrence. Symptoms may include high fever, tiredness, a burning sensation and difficulty or inability to urinate.
Q: What urologic conditions do you treat in women?
A: Older women often have to contend with recurrent urinary tract infections or bladder infections. There are some women who have trouble with bladder control, and some who feel sudden urgency to urinate. In a condition called stress incontinence, a woman loses bladder control when she performs a physical action such as laughing, coughing, sneezing or stretching.
Q: What can be done?
A: Suppressant antibiotics control infections. Urinary urgency can be controlled with an antispasmodic drug called ditropan.
Q: Do stress incontinence victims have any alternative to wearing protective undergarments?
A: Stress incontinence can often be treated by surgery to lift the urethra up by various procedures. No woman has to go around wearing diapers.
Q: Are children relatively free of urological problems?
A: I treat children for bedwetting, boys with undescended testes, and boys and girls for a condition called reflux. Reflux is a urine backup from the bladder to the kidneys. If untreated, it can cause chronic infection and the ultimate loss of the kidney. It is a very serious problem that needs immediate treatment. Any child with a urinary tract infection needs an X-ray and special evaluation of the kidneys and bladder.
Q: What conditions are indicated by blood in the urine?
A: It can be associated with kidney stones, kidney tumors or bladder tumors, in some cases. When you see this dramatic symptom you're likely to show up soon at the doctor's office.

Q: Your field deals with the structural side of impotence as well. Do more cases of impotence turn out to be physical or psychological?
A: Unfortunately used to feel that most cases of impotence were psychological, but now we feel more cases have an organic basis...
Q: Does impotence have any reversible organic causes?
A: Yes, vasculogenic impotence is one reversible cause...
Q: Are there treatments for impotence?
A: Three primarily. A chemical injection that promotes erection, a vacuum erection device, and implants. Implants are least commonly done because of the expense.
