WIC program is 20 years old

The WIC Program, formally known as "The Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants and Children," is celebrating 20 years of service to communities across America.

In January 1974 it marked the birth of the Program in Kentucky. Since that time WIC has flourished, serving currently provided in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and Guam. In the United States, over 1800 agencies are served by WIC. In Kentucky alone, over 120,000 women and children are presently being served. The WIC Program has become a well respected service and has demonstrated effectiveness in improving the health of its participants.

WIC is a federally funded nutrition program that provides nutritious food, nutrition assessment and nutrition education to women, infants and children under age five who qualify for the program; qualifications are based on income and nutritional risk assessment. The goals of WIC are to improve the outcome of high risk pregnancies; to decrease the incidence of anemia and poor growth patterns; and to improve the dietary habits of its recipients. Each applicant receives a basic health assessment and must be certified by a health professional to be at nutritional risk and low income before being admitted to the Program. Once a patient is admitted, the mother receives nutrition education, counseling and food instruments which are redeemable at local grocery stores for specific foods.
