**KU continues refund effort**

LEXINGTON, KY. (October 18, 1994)—Kentucky Utilities Co. (KU) announced today that it refunded nearly \$24 million to customers by means of a KU credit during July and August. In addition, three million has been returned to customers who have filed refund claims. KU continues to operate a Refund Processing Center to handle claims from the \$26 million from a coal contract dispute to correct and former customers. The Company would also like to return the approximately \$9 million that remains unclaimed.

KU is actively pursuing those customers who are due substantial refunds to return as much of the recovered money as possible. One of the successes includes the return of more than \$19,000 to Green River State in Boone County. This company had been 1985 through December 1990, realized it was due an additional refund from KU representatives contacted the company. Another former customer, F&M Industries of Pittsburgh, who operated two different coal mines in western Kentucky, was pleased when a KU representative called the company and asked its financial officer to apply for a refund of over \$18,000. In yet another
