PARENT INVOLVEMENT
Every research study on parent involvement conducted in the last 20 years has shown the same result: Parent involvement increases student achievement and self-esteem. Research has shown it to be true in both large and small communities, from preschool through high school, in poor and affluent areas, in urban and rural communities. According to the comprehensive report developed by Anne T. Henderson, The Evidence Continues to Grow: Parent Involvement Improves Student Achievement, more than 50 recent studies support the following statement:

There are three types of parent involvement programs: 1) Parents are the first teachers in a child's life. 2) Parents as partners with the school. 3) Parents as advocates for all children and youth in society. In addition, there are many principles of parent involvement that help support any successful parent involvement program. These include: 1) The focus on the child and his/her success. 2) All children can learn. 3) Parents are the best for their children. 4) The school cannot educate children alone. 5) Parents, regardless of ethnic group, socioeconomic status or educational background, are a key resource through their children's education. 6) Together as parents, schools, families, and communities can succeed in educating children who are able to lead happy, healthy, productive lives.

Jones declares November Gun Safety Month

FRANKFORT Gov. Bert Jones has declared November as Gun Safety Awareness Month in Kentucky. The Governor's office announced that the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR) and the Kentucky State Police (KSP) have announced they have planned numerous activities focused toward increasing public knowledge about firearms safety and the proper treatment of firearms in the home and while in the field.

KDFWR and KSP personnel will be working around the state throughout November to teach thousands of gun owners and hunters the proper use of firearms. The program will reach more than 100,000 individuals with the use of a mass e-mail message this month, as part of its regular conservation education program. Special gun safety and hunter education classes will also be taught by state troopers and KDFWR hunter education training officers. Troopers as well as state conservation officers will be distributing "Be Safe" stickers to kids as a reminder to remember what they've learned.

"We also intend to distribute several thousand trigger guards from bushes set up in some select urban area malls," Capt. Rodney Brewer, commander of the KSP's Public Affairs Division, said. "We will encourage gun owners to use these devices to help safeguard their firearms from being involved in an accident," Brewer added.

Two televised activities of particular interest include a special, one-hour call-in show at 8 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 17, on KET's station on gun safety, and a special edition of the Kentucky Afield for Kids Show available through KET's Star Channel. The live call-in show will be available through KET's Star Channel. Live panels from the KDFWR and the KSP who will respond to questions regarding handling firearms safely and responsibly. During the Kentucky Afield for Kids Show, a KSP officer and a KDFWR hunter training officer will discuss safety tips for children should they encounter a firearm.

The issue of gun safety continually becomes more important. Both the KDFWR and KSP support the responsible, safe and legal use of firearms. Most accidents involving firearms occur in the home. Statistics show that hunting is one of the safest forms of outdoor recreation, more so than swimming, fishing or even playing softball.
