1994 PROPOSED TAX RATE PUBLIC HEARING The Nicholas County Fiscal Court will hold a public hearing on October 13, 1994 at 6:00 p.m. at the Nicholas County Courthouse for the purpose of obtaining comments from the public regarding the proposed tax rates.

The tax rate levied last year was 12.4% and produced revenues in the amount of \$135,218. This year's compensating rate is 12.3% and will produce revenues in the amount of \$141,108. The Nicholas County Fiscal Court proposed a tax rate of 12.7% which will produce a total of \$145,697 in revenues.

Revenue expected from New Property is \$2,439; revenue expected from Personal Property is \$4,542; revenue expected from Motor Vehicles is \$33,546; and revenue expected from Watercraft is \$486.

Revenue received in excess of last year's revenue will be used for General Fund purposes.

The Kentucky General Assembly requires that the Nicholas County Fiscal Court publish this notice with the above information contained herein.
