Haley Jean McConnell turned one year old on Tuesday, August 30.

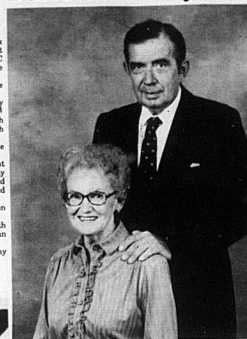
Haley celebrated her birthday with a big party, the theme of which was Sesame Street. Haley received many nice presents.
