Clark explained that with the population aging, and more people becoming eligible for the Homestead Exemption, the city should increase tax rates to help revenue lost each year.

The Homestead Exemption has increased, so we need to increase the rate just to stay even, Clark said. This 3 percent increase will bring in only about 100 additional dollars, if we leave it unchanged, we lose money.

Councilman Charles Fay made the motion to introduce the first reading of the ordinance to set the tax rate at 17 cents per hundred dollars assessed value, reflecting a 3 percent increase over last year's rate.

Council member Libby Earlowine objected to any increase in the tax.

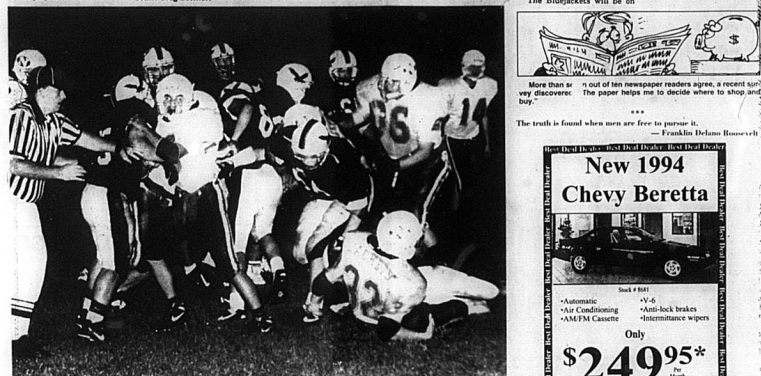
