In 1992, she broke 97.72 percent in the singles event and in that same year, broke 94.41 percent of 1,500 targets in the handicap event. She is the only woman ever to lead all three events in averages for two consecutive years.

Martin has broken 991 singles without a miss and 211 doubles without missing. She has broken 200 singles 44 times; the woman nearest this record has six 200 runs.

In 1950, Martin became the first woman ever to win the World Trapshooting Championship in Dublin Division at the Grand American held in Vandalia, Ohio.

She is the daughter of Peggy Moore of Pine Hills and the late, Herchel Moore, Jr.
