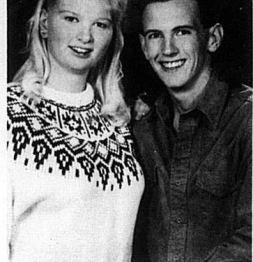

PUBLIC HEARING

In accordance with the provisions of HB 4 enacted by the 1973 Kentucky General Assembly a public hearing has been set by the Nicholas County Public Library District Board of Trustees for September 7, 1995 at 10:00 a.m. at the Nicholas County Public Library. The purpose of the hearing is to inform the public that the Nicholas County Public Library District is proposing the .0238 cent tax rate and anticipated revenue of \$25,754.24. This tax rate reflects a 4% increase in anticipated revenue. The tax rate for the preceding year was .0239 cents with revenues of \$27,418.02. The compensating tax rate is .0238 cents with anticipated revenue of \$28,653.89. The expected revenue from new property in 1996 is \$5,885.53. Increase for the 1995-96 budget year is needed due to the rising costs of books and library materials, equipment and building maintenance.

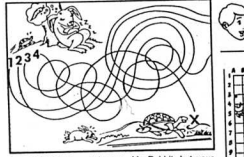

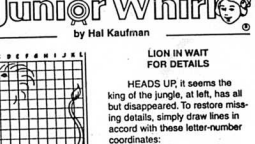

Balloon Shirt

Balloon Shirt Pattern

Make the shirt button one at a time to make the party sound.

Place tracing paper over the pattern. If not intended for very young children under three.

1. Make the balloons. Place pattern, face down, on plastic foam. To transfer pattern onto foam, rub 1 over pencil lines with coin. Cut out two or more balloons in the same way. Glue two wiggly eyes on each balloon over the eye marks. Use the black marker to trace over mouth and eye eyebrows. Cut flaps or curling ribbon into varying lengths. Tie the two lengths to the bottom of each balloon and cut the ribbon with scissors.

2. Assemble the balloons. Cut Velcro into three 2" strips. Separate the soft strip from the hard side. After deciding where to place the balloons, peel off the backing from the soft strips. Center strips vertically onto the back of balloons and press. Press balloons inside out.

3. To Wash Shirt. Remove balloons if using Velcro. Turn shirt outside out. Wash in cold water. Hang to dry.

Option: Make balloons into magnets by gluing a one-inch magnetic strip to center backs of balloons.
