

Blue Jackets roll over Fleming Panthers 8-6

The Nicholas County Blue Jackets rolled over Fleming County last Friday night at Carlisle, defeating the Panthers 8-6.

Things started out poorly for the Blue Jackets, who were held to zero yardage on their first possession. On the following kick, punter Justin Massey's ball struck Roger Vice in the back. Fleming County recovered inside the Nicholas County 20 yard line. The Blue Jacket defense toughened up and forced the Panthers to give up the ball. The rest of the first half was a repeat of the first five minutes: both teams found themselves unable to move the ball, trading interceptions and fumble recoveries.

It's like we were out there trading licks," Blue Jacket cornerback Aaron Willis said after the game. "The whole game came down to who wanted it most. And we wanted it most at the end."

The completion of the game changed completely on the third quarter.
Fleming County took the ball on their first possession and drove nearly the length of the field, led by career running back Tony McClone. McClone, however, was deflected from the game for unsportsmanlike conduct, which ended any momentum the Panthers had. Nicholas County took over from there.
Started by a Roger Vice fumble recovery and a 40 sprint by Wiley, the Blue Jackets found themselves deep inside Panther territory for the first time all night. Junior halfback Timmy Hopkins scored for the Blue Jackets on a 15-yard fumble recovery and a 40 sprint by Roger Vice walked into the end zone for a two-point conversion. Up 40, the Blue Jackets would score no more.
The game remained largely a defensive struggle until the 10:30 mark of the fourth quarter, when Fleming County's Damon Hitch scored a six-yard skirt around the end. The Panther confusion attempt failed, ending the scoring for the night.
Nicholas County's defense held the Panthers for the remaining moments of the game, sealing the Blue Jacket victory.

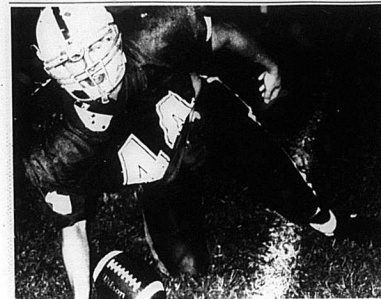

The Blue Jackets will travel to Dayton next week. Hope everyone can come out and watch the action.

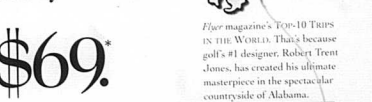
