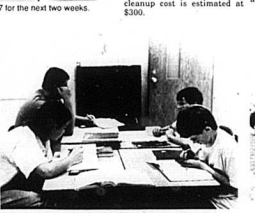
gineering, communications, cooking, mechanic and heavy equipment operators.

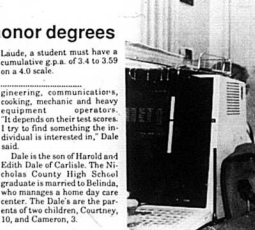
