**Nicholas County Co-Operative Extension Notes**  
 Families in the southern region increased their spending faster than their income during 1993, but decreased their contributions to charity during the same time, according to the latest Bureau of Labor statistics report and Melba A. Burch, Nicholas County Extension Agent for Home Economics. The data, which is from 1993, is the most current available and may or may not represent a trend. Further, the data represents averages, any given family may have spending patterns quite different.  
 On the average, southern region consumers increased their expenditures more than their income. This indicates either a decrease in savings and investments or an increase in consumer debt or a combination of both. Families in the southern region, where Kentucky data is found, had average annual expenditures of \$29,247. This is about a five percent increase from 1992. At the same time, average income before taxes rose only about four percent over 1992 income. Consumers in the southern region reported the lowest income of the fourth regions in the U. S. with an average income before taxes of \$32,364. Ms. Burch says that the high average in the U. S. was \$37,592 which was reported in the western region.  
 Where did the southern families spend their money? The largest expenditure category for southern consumers, as well as all consumers in the nation, was housing, where they reported 30 percent of their spending. The actual average expenditure for consumers was \$8,762 per year, an increase of four percent over the 1992 average. Of this figure, just over half of the money spent went for shelter, about a fourth for utilities, fuels and public services and 13 percent went for furnishings and equipment. The remainder was spent for household operating expenses.

spending for entertainment a whopping 29 percent during the year. Entertainment was 5.6 percent of their total expenditures during the year. Health care costs also increase by almost 13 percent during the year, representing 6.6 of total consumer expenditures. Other expenditures showing substantial increases were clothing and related services up five percent, education up 11.7 percent and life insurance up 10.5 percent.
