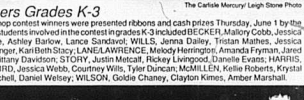

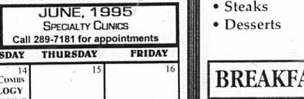

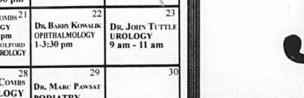

THE HOLOCAUST

September 1, 1939, Germany invades Poland. This is what some consider to be the beginning of World War II. A war that would last more years, leaving in its path more than six million Jews... slaughtered.

In its wake, the beating heart of the hatred in Germany, Adolf Hitler. He came into power January 30, 1933, in what was to become a reign of terror.

This began the Holocaust, although the oppression of the Jews had been going on forever. Hitler seized Germany with his hypnotic orator skills. He used his despotic political skills to lead the German people to World War I, Germany looked to rise. "Hitler, Hitler," they declared.

At first they did not see him as a tyrant, but later, concentration camps were set up, Jews transported from their homes. They were loaded in cattle cars and many suffered. Hitler's right-hand man, Adolf Berman, estimated the number of Jews that would suffer at 200,000. They were forced to work with little pay, and not allowed to practice their religion. The sick were shot, gassed, and cremated. Created in secret are Jewish ghettos.

Concentration camps and death camps were built at Auschwitz, Treblinka, Brana, and over 200 more. Corpses thrown into the air and used as targets by heartless soldiers. Their heads were shaved, their names changed, even given new names. They were to be exterminated. Other with no scientific and no mercy shown. They became numbers and suffered such indignities that people didn't want to believe, were afraid to believe. Families were separated and witnessed each other die. The most painful death was the gas chamber. Hitler believed in the Aryan race, blond hair, and blue eyes. Not only Jews, but also Jewish's witnesses, gypsies and homosexuals were treated by German society.

An example of those who were prominent Germans helped Jewish's Jews. In the late summer of 1941, Hitler decided the extermination of all Jews through the "Final Solution". One point one million people died in Auschwitz. Ninety four percent of the Jews who never came out. Fritz Fritzsche asked, "... it is a bad dream, one that never goes away." Heinrich Himmler, a German commander, saw it as "that final, right duty to die."

With each generation we should remember. Remember the deaths, the appalling loss of so many, by so many. We teach our children and our grandchildren about the Holocaust. I must have faith in words, in language, in man and his faith in the possibility of every human to be a good person, to be a human in spite of everything."

We must remember for the ones who died, and the ones who are here. Remember for the ones who have looked death in the face and how a part of them has died and will never be replaced. Those who refuse the nightmare every day. As was quoted in the documentary "Force of Will", the Holocaust was "done to you, to people. People... like us."

District can also apply for a loan from the Rural Economic Community Development Agency, formerly known as Farmers Administration. The grant loan can only be applied for once a year.

The county's been asking for surveys to be returned since mid-April. The project was funded mainly by County Judge Ernestine Clark Smith, NCDW Chairman Sam Reynolds and Billburg ADD. The grant application deadline is mid-July.

The county government's involvement in the project stems from the HUD legislation that only cities and counties may apply for HUD grants, whereas the Nicholas County Water District can apply for the RECD loan itself, Hassall said.
