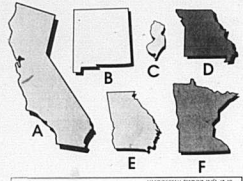

Family Tree by Dottie Maughan

- GET READY...
• One 10" sturdy white paper plate
• Felt: brown and green
• Acrylic paints: light blue, red, metallic gold
• Milk-bottle caps (one for each family member)
• Family photos
• White paper
• Fine-line black marker
• Craft glue
• Paintbrush, pencil, scissors, tracing paper

GO! Paint bottle caps red, inside of paper plate blue, and rim gold. Let dry. Cut out pictures of family members. Use marker to draw veins on leaves and bark on trunk. Glue pictures to inside of caps.

From green felt, cut leaves. From brown felt, cut a tree trunk with one branch for each family member. Use marker to draw veins on leaves and bark on trunk. Print each name on a small piece of white paper.

See photo. Glue tree to center of plate. Glue leaves to branches. With oldest members at tree top, glue one bottle cap to inside of each leaf. Glue name on leaf next to picture.

(Option: Use construction paper instead of felt for leaves and write on the felt instead of paper. Glue youngest member to bottom of trunk.)

How many times does the Lord's Prayer appear in the Bible? Answer: Ten, once in Matthew VI and once in Luke XI.

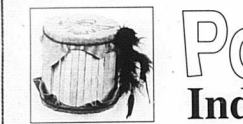

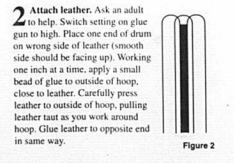
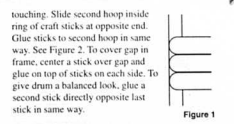
POW-WOW-FUN! Indian Tom-Tom

It's made with embroidery hoops and craft sticks! by Terri Quillen

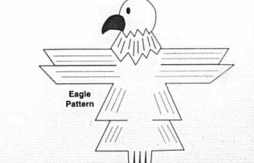
- GET READY...
• 2 round embroidery hoops (inner rings only)
• 36 craft sticks, 4-1/2" long
• 2 ragged 7" squares of soft leather
• 1 yard of red rawhide lace
• 6 black craft feathers in assorted sizes
• 1 red regular-point permanent marking pen
• Tools: pencil, tracing paper, 2-temperature glue gun and glue sticks
• 1 vanishing marker

GET SET... Place tracing paper over pattern. Trace pattern and cut out. Preheat glue gun on low setting.

GO! Make drum frame. See Figure 1. Glue craft sticks onto embroidery hoop so that rounded tips are even with outer edge of hoop. Make sure sides of sticks are touching. Slide second hoop inside ring of craft sticks at opposite end. Glue sticks to second hoop in same way. See Figure 2. To cover gap in frame, center a stick over gap and glue on top of sticks on each side. To give drum a balanced look, glue a second stick directly opposite last stick in same way.



3 Finish Up. See photo. Cut rawhide lace in half. Tie one length tightly around one end of drum. Knot ends. Center eagle pattern on one end of drum, making sure wing is pointing to knot at side. Use vanishing marker to trace around outside lines of pattern. Remove pattern. Draw in wing lines, neck and tail feathers, beak line and eye with marker. Don't worry about mistakes, as they will vanish. Trace over all marker lines with red pen. Glue feathers over leather knot at top of drum.
