be equipped with a cutting table, heat, lights, toilet and lounge facilities and ventilation fans. These alterations are to be made by J.M. Patterson, which estimates that approximately \$500,000 will be required for the project.

Giffin, in turn, promised to pay rental on the building, assured that his industry would maintain a payroll of at least 50 persons, and furnish bond in the amount the number of the association would put up for the necessary alterations.

Members of the association said that the bond Giffin put up would be forfeited if the proposed industry does not become permanent. They added that at the event, Giffin expanded his facilities, after a time, the original bond would be used to cover the expansion program.

Giffin has told the members of the association that the equipment necessary to keep operation of the factory already has been purchased and shipment is expected by February 15. He agreed that the alterations on the building would not have to be authorized until the association had a sample proof of contracts for orders of garments to be manufactured.

The association has already secured an option on a brick building building.

The association has been advised that the manufacturer of men's shirts will be the principal product of the proposed factory. Plans call for the establishment of one unit, which will require the services of 38 women on the assembly line and a supervisory force of at least 12 persons.

Giffin announces factory opening
