CONVECTION OVENS COOK FASTER! COOKING TEMPERATURES IN RECIPES

If you buy a new oven and find that it happens to be a convection oven, you may have to adjust cooking temperatures in recipes, advises Molla Bursh, Nicholas County Extension Agent for Home Economics. Convection ovens, used in commercial cooking since the 1850s, have a fan that circulates heated air over the food. The moving air allows heat to surround whatever is being cooked. Meats cook faster and juicier when cooked in a convection oven. Cooking temperatures usually can be reduced by 25 degrees compared with times for conventional ovens. Cooking times may need to be reduced as well.

In addition, multiple baking racks allow for large quantities of food to be cooked at the same time. Because the heat is being circulated by the fan, the foods all cook evenly. Foods that contain a lot of fat and moisture usually have good results with convection cooking.

Another difference between conventional and convection ovens is the need to preheat the oven. Convection ovens do not require preheating before baking. As with any new mode of cooking, trial and error may be required to become familiar with the convection oven. Babbage announces record voter registration

A total of 4,644 Nicholas County residents are now registered to vote in the May 23 primary election, according to Secretary of State Bob Babbage. Kentucky voter registration reached a new high with 2,178,351 currently registered. This number surpasses the previous record of 2,160,192 set prior to the 1993 General Election. "Over 100 contributing factors to the increase in voter registration is the expanded registration opportunities offered under the Motor Vehicle Law which was enacted this year," Babbage explained.
