Tobacco representatives dispute FDA plans

LEXINGTON - Some of Kentucky's leading tobacco growers and buyers met with federal government representatives to discuss the continuing budget debate, said members of Congress, voiced opposition Nov. 20 to the Food and Drug Administration plan to regulate the tobacco industry. The federal government's latest measures to further restrict the industry, according to a release from The Council For Burley Tobacco. A news conference held simultaneously at tobacco warehouses in Lexington and in Shelbyville on the opening day of this year's burley sales, 20-foot by four foot banners proclaiming "Keep FDA off the farm" were unveiled. It was announced that the banners will appear in warehouses throughout the Burley Belt. Lexington, U.S. Rep. Scotty Baesler (D-Lexington) said, "Tobacco farmers simply do not need more government regulation. This is the message that must be heard loud and clear by FDA Commissioner David Keiser and President Clinton. And you need to be the messenger."

You've probably heard about Carpal Tunnel Syndrome (CTS) and its effect on computer operations, like in computer programmers and assembly line workers. Maybe you even know someone who suffers from it. But what exactly is CTS, and how do you avoid getting it? Carpal tunnel syndrome is a condition possibly caused by the repetition of stressful motions with your hand or by holding your wrist in the same position for long periods of time. CTS is classified as a cumulative trauma disorder which means, basically, that it is a condition that develops over time. CTS can be crippling, prevent-

More Kentuckians qualify for mammograms at health dept.

FRANKFORT - More Kentucky women now qualify for free mammograms through their local health department because of an increase in the income eligibility level. Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths among Kentucky women. The Kentucky Department for Health Services has increased the income eligibility level from 185 percent of the federal poverty level to 200 percent of the federal poverty level for the mammography program. A mammogram is breast X-ray that can detect a lump in the breast up to six years before a woman or her doctor can feel it. Each year approximately 2,400 Kentucky women are diagnosed with breast cancer and about 655 women die from the disease. Since Kentucky breast cancer screening program began in 1990, about 21,000 women have been screened by local health departments. In 1993, more than 72 percent of these cases were diagnosed in the early stages of the disease when the prognosis is best. Women eligible for mammograms are referred to a mammography center. It is important for the mammogram to be based on a sliding fee scale. Mammograms will cost up to \$56 depending on the woman's income level and family size. A woman is referred to service because of an inability to pay.
