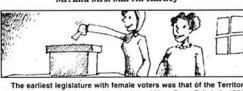

LEGAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATE INCREASE
In accordance with the requirements of the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky as set forth in KY KAR 5.069, Section 4, notice is hereby given to the customers of the Nicholas County Board of Water and Sewerage Utility of Bath and Nicholas Counties, Kentucky, that an increase in the rate schedule is set forth herein. The proposed rate increase is required by the Rural Electric and Community Development Board in connection with a loan by the RECD to the District of \$289,000 to be evidenced by the issuance by the District of its Waterworks Revenue Bonds in such amount, and the RECD has agreed to purchase provided the District meet certain conditions of the RECD, including increasing water rates as set forth below:
Current Monthly Rates: First 2,000 gallons: \$12.80 minimum bill; Next 3,000 gallons: \$2.80 per 1,000 gallons; Next 5,000 gallons: \$2.00 per 1,000 gallons; All over 10,000 gallons: \$1.80 per 1,000 gallons. Connection Charge: \$18 • 3/4" Meter: \$400 (0) which includes a read here, where necessary, using bring equipment owned by the District. The actual cost of such items shall be added to the \$400 connection charge. All other meter sizes - Actual Cost. The RECD has agreed to contribute in conjunction with the minimum amount of \$85,000, an RECD Grant in the amount of \$242,000, and an Appalachian Regional Commission Grant in the amount of \$150,000 to finance the cost of extensions, additional and improvements to the existing waterworks system of the District, consisting of approximately 25 miles of water lines to serve the following areas: Nicholas County (a) East Union, Lower Sharpshurg Road, Convent area, (b) Route 57 and Route 1855 area, (c) West Union Lane, (d) John Dunn Road, Bath County (a) Northridge Branch, (b) Sanderson Road, (c) Oakley Pebble Road (Route 1002); (2) Bath County (Route 1262), Route 11, Lefford Road (Route 6) Springfield Road, Sigmond, Mike Pryor, Chairman, Sharpshurg and Water District, Sharpshurg, Kentucky.
