CARLISLE - Further discussion on the Nicholas County Water District's request for the city to sell the agency an increased water limit was postponed by Carlisle City Council. The NCWD buys water from the city with a limit of four million gallons per month. It had asked for an increase allowing for eight million gallons in order to service 100 more customers in the county. The NCWD has contended that some people in the county had contaminated water and would benefit from city water. No representative of the NCWD was in attendance at Monday night's regular council meeting.

I don't think anyone objects to that, but we have to have the best deal. If we can't provide them with something, I'm sure they'll find someone who will." The mayor said the needs of city residents must come first, especially considering the capacity limitations of the water plant. Jockey needs increased water for expansion, the mayor will seek a grant to up the capacity at the plant. Jockey currently uses 70 million gallons of water per month now and may increase usage up to 20 percent per month.

According to a news release from the water office, waterline construction should begin within 45 days of the bid opening or sometime around the end of the year. The District will continue to accept tap fee payments at the current \$300 rate until the start of construction. The tap fee will be raised to \$400 once construction begins.
