Getting a mammogram is easier due to new service

LEXINGTON - Getting a mammogram about to become easier because of new mammography locator service provided by the National Cancer Institute. The NCI's 1-800-4-CANCER is a toll-free, 24-hour, nationwide service providing names of FDA-certified mammography facilities in the caller's area, based on zip code, state, city or county. The service is available 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. weekdays.

The service, offered exclusively through NCI's Cancer Information Service, is being promoted nationwide in October, National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

The new CIS service is a result of the 1992 Mammography Quality Standards Act, which requires mammography facilities across the nation to meet uniform quality standards enforced by the FDA.

Breast cancer is the second leading cause of death from cancer for women and will kill nearly half a million women in the 1990s. Most experts agree that regular mammography screening can reduce breast cancer mortality by about one-third for women aged 50 and over.
