### Loretta Mann restores historic home and prepares for Christmas craft season



The Loretta Mann workshop is filled with woven rags, with the baggy wheels woven rags a specialty. Mann has a healthy supply of rags and quilts and will accept requests. She plans to have her annual Christmas show in November and hopes her Civil War era home will be completely refurbished for display. Mann is sometimes helped with her crafts by her husband, Bill. "He cuts the patterns," she says.

Payne remodelled the kitchen 19 years ago and did such a fine job, the Mann's asked him to restore their home. The home is full of history. The remains of the Myers family are in a cemetery behind the home on the rail across the railroad track. The home originally faced the track. Mann still has a letter written by a Myers when he was planning for Gold out west. The Myers family is related to G. C. Myers, owner of Carlisle Drug.
