ORDINANCE NO. 4, 1995
AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED CITY OF CARLISLE AS VARIOUS TAXES FOR GENERAL MUNICIPAL PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1995 THROUGH JUNE 30, 1996 ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE TAXING JURISDICTION OF THE CITY, ON EACH ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS OF JANUARY 1, 1995 ASSESSED VALUATION, AS FOLLOWS: ON REAL PROPERTY AND PERSONAL PROPERTY, INCLUDING REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANIES, EXCEPT MOTOR VEHICLES AND WATERCRAFT; SEVENTEEN CENTS (0.17%); ON MANUFACTURED PRODUCTS NOT IN THE HANDS OF THE PRODUCER; SEVENTEEN CENTS (0.17%); ON BARE SHARES; SEVENTEEN CENTS (0.17%).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:
SECTION 1: That for the purposes of support of the government of the City of Carlisle, and the payment of its debts and expenses for the fiscal year July 1, 1995 through June 30, 1996, there be and hereby be levied ad valorem taxes on each one hundred (\$100.00) dollars of the January 1, 1995 assessed valuation by the Nicholas County Property Valuation Administrator of all taxable property within the taxing jurisdiction of the City, as follows:
a. Real property and personal property, including real and personal property of public service companies on the Department of Revenue assessed valuation, except motor vehicles and watercraft: seventeen cents (0.17%).
b. Insurance capital: seventeen cents (0.17%).
c. Unmanufactured products not in the hands of the producer or the agent of the producer: seventeen cents (0.17%).
d. Bare shares: seventeen cents (0.17%).
SECTION 2: All ad valorem taxes shall be paid to the City Clerk, and are levied for general fund purposes.
SECTION 3: All taxes paid by October 30, 1995 will be allowed a two (2%) percent discount. All taxes not paid before December 31, 1995 shall be assessed a six (6%) percent penalty. In addition, interest on taxes not paid after the delinquency date shall be assessed on all delinquent taxes.
SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 2, 1995

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 36 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCREASE THE PAY GRADE OF WATER PLANT OPERATOR II FROM 17 TO 19, AND THE PAY GRADE OF SEWER PLANT OPERATOR II FROM 17 TO 19.

Be it ordained by the City of Carlisle:
Section 1. That Section 36.022 be and hereby is amended to increase the pay grade for the position of Water Plant Operator II from pay grade 17 to pay grade 19, and to increase the pay grade for the position of Sewer Plant Operator II from pay grade 17 to pay grade 19, so that Section 36.022 reads as follows:
