Paintsville thrashes Bluejackets 26-8

The Nicholas County Tigers last Friday night at Paintsville, beating the Tigers in a 26-8 rout.

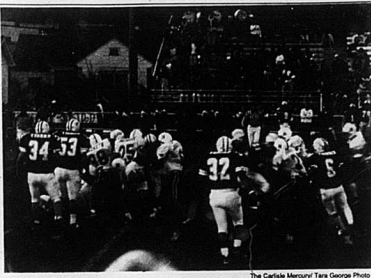
During the fourth quarter, both teams continued to trade leads, with Nicholas County threatening once but having its pass intercepted, and Paintsville scoring again on a 23 yard pass, upping their lead to 26-0.

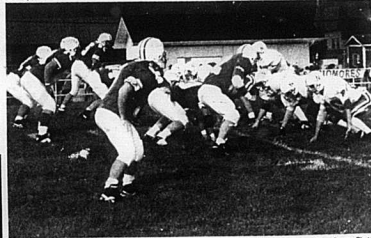
On their first play from scrimmage, from over 60 yards out, the Tigers scored again, capitalizing on broken tackles and what seemed like defensive confusion on the part of the Bluejackets.

The second quarter was pretty much a defensive struggle, with neither team able to move the ball very well. With time running down in the second quarter, however, the Bluejackets went to the air. Behind the Tiger Vee and some awesome hands by pumped-up tight end Rodney Mitchell, Nicholas County moved the ball into scoring position, but with the ball on Nicholas County's 15 yard line, Bluejackets coughed it up and stalled their own drive.

"We played pretty well after the first couple of minutes," Bluejacket head coach Greg Letcher said. "We put together a fairly effective offense early in the first half, but we fumbled the ball when it came time to punch it in for the score."
