City designates clean-up days

The City of Carlisle has designated Friday, April 20 and Monday, April 29, as clean-up days in Carlisle.

The city will pick up limbs, brush, and small trees. These items will need to be cut up into two or three-foot pieces for easier handling. Stumps, boards, small rocks, weeds and leaves will also be picked up.

According to a release from the city, there will be no charge for the disposal of refrigerators, freezers, stoves, air conditioners, washing machines, and dryers. However, there will be a \$5 (each) charge for items such as chairs, lawn springs, mattresses, and water heaters. The cost to dispose of a couch or commode will be \$7. The city will also accept 17 tires at \$2 each, 16" to 19" at \$3.50 each, and 20" to 22" at \$4 each.

The city will not accept tractor tires.

Treadway was arrested and charged with DUI, failure to use seatbelt, and no insurance. He was lodged in the Bourbon County Detention Center.

The passenger, five year old Danny Treadway, Jr., received minor injuries to his face. He was treated and released from the Nicholas County Hospital.
