The Licking River Clear Water Actley will make its way through Nicholas County on April 26th and 27th.

The relay is carrying a water sample from the river source in Maguffin County to Newport, where the Licking River joins the Ohio River.

The 303 mile trip is designed to show support for one of Kentucky's most important natural resources.

Kentucky has more miles of running water than any of the contiguous 48 states. Though the Licking River is one of the cleanest in the state, potential threats of landfills, a growing population, and unsafe environmental practices threaten the river.
