4-H hosts Earth Day celebration for sixth graders

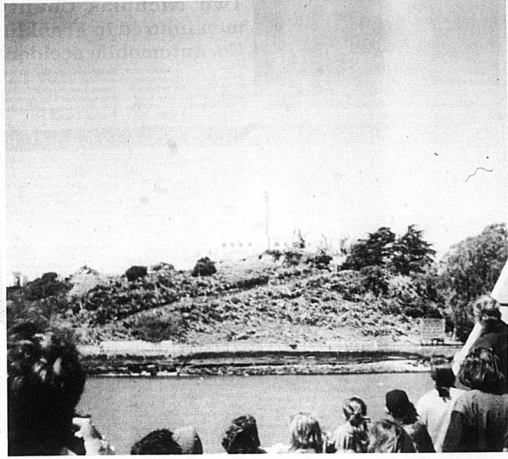

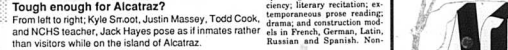
