The Nicholas County BlueJacket football squad traveled to Grayson, last Friday to take on the East Carter Raiders in their final scrimmage of the year. Dropping the game 28-0, the BlueJackets fared poorly on the scoreboard.

But the scoreboard wasn't our opponent. Head coach Greg Lecher said. "We were there to learn, and to look at specific players in specific positions. The scoreboard only showed what was happening in a few situations. We learned about a lot of things we need to work on."

The game pretty much belonged to the East Carter Raiders, who scored the ball most of the first half, stopping the BlueJackets and forcing them to punt the ball in the first half. Micaea came on kickoff receptions and running plays.

"I think we may have been a little nervous," Lecher said. "But, some of the mistakes we made were on fundamental things we really hadn't concentrated on in practice. Maybe we

assumed we had the stuff done. We'll work on these things this week on these things. The second half was mostly the same sad song. The raiders continued to stop the jackets from scoring, and kept adding points to their side of the scoreboard. To begin the third and final quarter, with the score 21-0, the BlueJackets had little hope of turning it around and owning the last half. The BlueJackets took the field with a little fire in their eyes but even though they played a little better, the game ended with a final score of 28-0.

The scrimmages were very helpful, Lecher said. "Our players have seen almost every defense and offensive formation they'll face this year. Like I said, the scoreboard in a scrimmage really means nothing. What matters is what you get out of it, and how we played at Carroll County last week."

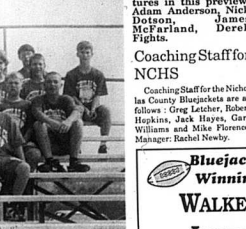
Jackets Coach Speaks
