

U.K. Pulmonary specialty clinic to begin services at JMHC

Respiratory disease, especially COPD, is one of the major reasons people are admitted to Nicholas County Hospital. There is a definite need in this community for a pulmonary clinic.

"It is especially glad that a specialty clinic at UK Hospital agreed to provide these services. They're an outstanding group of physicians. Best thing of all is that they can be seen in our community," Herschberg said.

In addition to their clinic on March 22nd, the pulmonary clinic is scheduled for April 12th, May 3rd, and May 26th.

"If we can help meet a community need by bringing our services to Nicholas County, we're glad to do it. We believe patients should be able to receive health care as conveniently as possible," Gowin said.
