**NOTICE TO ALL HIGH SCHOOL PARENTS:**

The Kentucky Education Reform Act of 1990 provides an official role to their children's school. This act allows Site-Based Decision Making (SBDM) at each school.

The School Council (SC) is a decentralized shared decision-making process in which the local school is the place where most of the decisions about schooling take place. The School Council (SC) will be composed of the following members: the principal, as the chairman, two parents, and three teachers.

The following is a list of the qualifications necessary for parents to serve:

- Parent must have a child in the school during the time they serve.
- Parent representatives shall not be a relative of any district employee.
- Parent members must be willing to attend training sessions preparing them for effective team efforts as required by law.
- Parent members must be willing to work as a team and be interested in improving educational opportunities for all the children in that school.

Key words describing Parent Members: Knowledgeable, flexible, open, effective, objective, supportive, polite, impersonal, and diplomatic.

The election of parent members to the council shall be a majority vote of qualified parents who are present at a meeting for that purpose.

**QUALIFIED PARENTS**

- Only those parents who have a child currently enrolled in that school are eligible to vote for parent members.
- The process will be by secret ballot.
- Consentation shall be made in writing and submitted to the principal up to five school days prior to the date scheduled for the election.
- Parent council members must be high school graduates or have earned a GED.
- Parent council members shall be a parent, step parent, or legal guardian of a student currently enrolled in the school.
- Parent council members shall not be district employees.

Terms for school council members shall be one year beginning July 1st. Parent members are eligible for re-election.

All qualifying parents are invited to attend a community election meeting on May 20th at 7:00 p.m. in the high school cafeteria. The purpose of this meeting shall be to elect the school council parent members. All parents are invited to submit those names that satisfy the qualifications who are willing to put in hard work and time in the interests of our children. **EXTENSION NEWS**  
 The Nicholas County Extension Service is initiating the development of a new and exciting collaborative effort in the Nicholas County community. As many of you are already aware, Hispanic migrant farm workers have recent years become part of Nicholas County's farm labor force. In the past, many farm families and neighbors to have, during June through September. As hiring labor sources have diminished, most farm families are being forced to meet the health and social needs of the migrant population.

There are a broad range of issues that arise from the working migrant population. Cultural and language barriers, health care and social service needs, and the impact of migrant farm workers on the local economy are among the matters which need to be thoroughly discussed among an ample range of community members. The initial meeting of the Nicholas County Migrant Resource Coalition will take place on Tuesday, May 21, 11:30 a.m. in the offices of the Nicholas County Extension Service. While letters of invitation have been sent to specific community members, everyone with an interest in migrant issues is welcome to attend this meeting. Bring your lunch and sign up.
