The Extension office provided the resources obtained at this conference to all the participants at the Nicholas County meeting. Following a review of this information, participants began listing specific problems and issues related to the Nicholas County migrant farm worker population.
These problems included a lack of reliable information on the number of migrants in the county, language barriers between residents and migrants, a lack of communication between agencies of limited resources that work with the migrant population, and a limited understanding by migrants of the local legal system.
The group which met on Tuesday was comprised of a wide variety of organizations and individuals with interests in the migrant farm worker population. Participants included Dr. Wendell Kinsinger of Nicholas County Public Health Department, Melissa Poyman and Troy Decker of the Circuit Clerk's office, Larry Klumper, Nicholas County's Title I Migrant Advocate, Carolyn Baker of the Department of Social Services, Margaret Hunter of Community Action, Frances West of Johnson-Mathers Health Care, Charles Cramer of the Family Resource and Youth Services Center, and Mike Phillips and John Mark Hack of the Extension Service.
