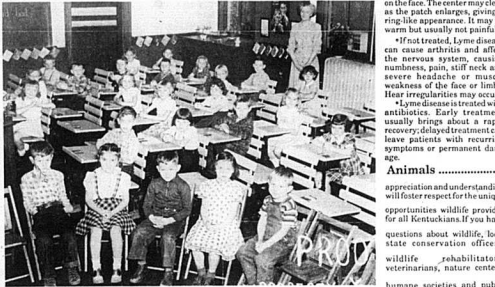

crushing the body. If tweezers are not available, cover the fingers with a tissue.
• Wash hands and the area of the bite immediately with soap and water, and keep the bite area clean.
• Do not try to crush the tick. Instead, flush it down a toilet or save it in a tightly closed vial for later identification.
• Early treatment is the key to complete recovery from both of these diseases, so if you are bitten by tick, watch closely for symptoms and contact your physician immediately if the symptoms occur," Palmer said.
"Many of the symptoms can resemble other problems, so people should tell their doctor about any recent tick bites."
Rocky Mountain spotted fever symptoms:
• Fever and possible chills, headache and muscle aches three to 10 days after a tick bite.
• In about half of the cases, a rash appears one to three days after the fever. It usually starts on the wrists and ankles and then spreads to the rest of the body.
• Use the term "spotted fever" severely range from mild to fatal. The disease can be treated effectively with antibiotics, but early diagnosis and treatment are critical. In the absence of appropriate treatment, 15 percent to 10 percent of people with the disease die.
Lyme disease symptoms:
• The first stage begins three to 32 days after a tick bite. Flu-like symptoms are present: fatigue, chills and fever, headache, muscle and joint pain or swollen lymph nodes.
• Another sign is a peculiar circular skin rash that appears most often on the thigh, groin, trunk, arms and, in children, on the face. The center may clear as the patch enlarges, giving a ring-like appearance. It may be warm but usually not painful.
• If not treated, Lyme disease can cause arthritis and affect the nervous system, causing numbness, pain, stiff neck and severe headache or muscle weakness of the face or limbs. Heart irregularities may occur.
• Lyme disease is treated with antibiotics. Early treatment usually brings about a rapid recovery, but delayed treatment can leave patients with recurring symptoms or permanent damage.
