Entomologist warns: Now is peak time for yellowjackets

Yellowjackets with a stinging bite and empty stomachs are peaking outdoors this time of year. "Active nesting peaks in late summer and foraging colonies intensify as workers seek food for developing queens and other members of the colony," said Mike Potter, urban entomologist for the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.

"Because they want a steady source of carbohydrates, workers are especially attracted to sweet foods such as soft drinks, iced tea, ice cream and beer. Yellowjackets will fly during the day, then come out in late summer or early fall."

"Workers also scavenge for popular picnic items such as ham, tuna salad and bread." Sometimes people mistake yellowjackets for bees; but their behavior and food preferences distinguish them from bees, according to Potter.

"Yellowjackets are more annoying than honeybees and have a persistent habit of scavenging for food at picnics and outdoor restaurants," he said.

Potter said the best way to reduce the annoying presence of yellowjackets is to minimize food sources that attract them. "When eating outdoors, keep food and beverages covered until you're ready to eat promptly clean up spills and leftovers," he said. "Put garbage in a trash can with a tight-fitting lid. If one isn't available, put trash in double plastic bags and close securely."

"To reduce foraging at picnic stands, outdoor cafe, ice cream stands, parks and recreation areas, put trash cans and dumpsters away from high-traffic areas like serving areas."
