Carlisle has new sports bar

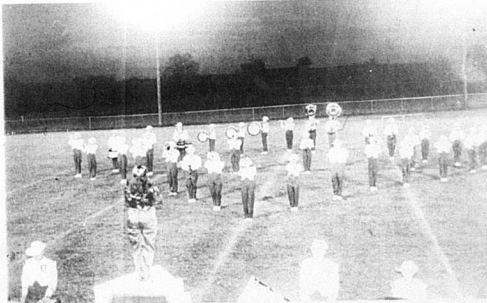
