NOTICE OF ADOPTION AND SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 7, 1996 BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY

The undersigned City Clerk of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky hereby states pursuant to Section 83A.00003 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes that on September 9, 1996, the City of Carlisle, Kentucky adopted, by second reading, an Ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY AUTHORIZING (i) THE PARTICIPATION OF THE CITY IN THE KENTUCKY MUNICIPAL LEAGUE POOLED LEASE FINANCING PROGRAM, (ii) THE FINANCING BY THE CITY THROUGH THE PROGRAM OF CERTAIN PROJECTS AND (iii) THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A VARIABLE RATE LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE KENTUCKY MUNICIPAL FINANCE CORPORATION, AS LESSOR, AND THE CITY, AS LESSEE, UNDER WHICH THE CITY WILL LEASE FROM THE CORPORATION THE PROPERTY THEREIN DESCRIBED, AND TAKING OTHER RELATED ACTION

This Ordinance authorizes the participation by the City of Carlisle, Kentucky (the "City") in the Kentucky Municipal League Pooled Lease Financing Program to finance the acquisition, construction and installation of various improvements (the "Project") to the City's municipal waterworks, sewer and gas system (the "System") and the execution and delivery of a variable rate lease purchase agreement in a principal amount not to exceed \$510,000 between the City and the Kentucky Municipal Finance Corporation (the "Corporation") to provide the financing with respect to the Project.

Preparation Certificate The undersigned Attorney at Law, licensed to practice in Kentucky, hereby certifies that the foregoing summary of Ordinance No. 7, 1996 of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky, was prepared by the undersigned and constitutes a general summary of essential provisions of said ordinance, reference to the full text of which ordinance is hereby made for a complete statement of its provisions and terms.

ORDINANCE NO. 8, 1996 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY FOR THE PROPERTIES COMPRISING THE HIGHWAY COURT LIBRARY AT 223 NORTH BROADWAY...

WHEREAS, the City of Carlisle, Kentucky, Independent Planning Commission has recommended, pursuant to applicable law, to the City Council, the City of Carlisle, Kentucky, that the zoning map be amended changing the zoning classification of the properties comprising the Nicholas County Library at 223 North Broadway...

WHEREAS, prior to said recommendation, the Planning Commission held a public hearing on the application of W. H. Kingsolver, Virginia Kingsolver and Joseph H. Conroy requesting the amendment; and

WHEREAS, said proposed amendment is appropriate and is in agreement with the City of Carlisle Comprehensive Plan and conforms to the applicable provisions of 880.100.213

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY: 1. That the zoning map of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky, be and the same be hereby amended as follows: The properties comprising the Nicholas County Library at 223 North Broadway, the house owned by Rachel S. 2. Pursuant to Article IV, Section 4.1.4 of the Zoning Ordinance of Carlisle, Kentucky, the Independent Planning Commission and the Enforcement Officer shall insure that the above amendment to the zoning map is accurately placed, noted, dated and installed.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
