Battle of Blue Licks in Aug. 1875. The annual re-enactment is also scheduled for this weekend.

Battle History

The Battle of Blue Licks occurred Aug. 19, 1782, when 162 Kentuckians, in defense of home and country, met about 200 Indians and some 25 white British soldiers and renegades under the command of the British, Captain William Caldwell.

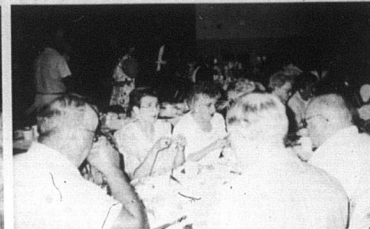

7. WAGE RATES

8. CIVIL RIGHTS COMPLIANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 6, 1997 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES INCREASING PAY GRADES AS FOLLOWS: POLICE OFFICER FROM \$10 TO \$12 POLICE SERGEANT FROM \$0 TO \$2 BETTILING AND INCREASING THE GRADE OF SEWAGE PLANT OPERATOR TO \$20 CREATING THE POSITIONS OF WATER PLANT OPERATOR CLASS IIA AT GRADE 18 AND WATER PLANT OPERATOR CLASS IIB, LICENSED AT GRADE 21, INCREASING THE GRADE OF MAINTENANCE WORKER FROM 18 TO 16 AND DELETING THE POSITION OF SLUDGE HAULER. Be it ordained by the City of Carlisle: Section 1.
