Carlisle tries for million dollar housing grant

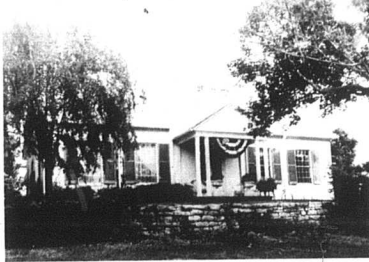
