Housing Project

He was a Methodist minister having served in Mason, Lewis, Fleming, Bath and Nicholas Cos.

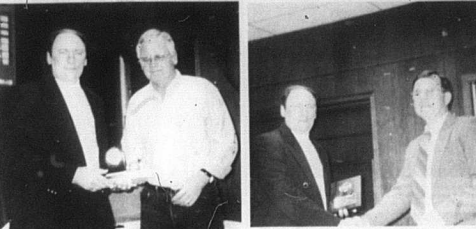

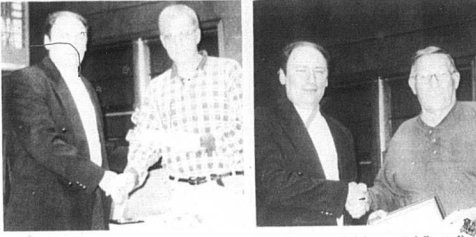

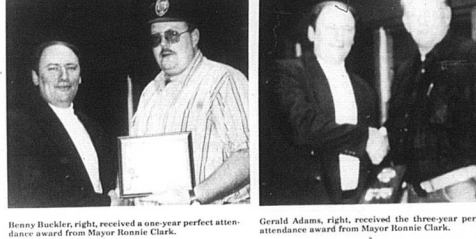

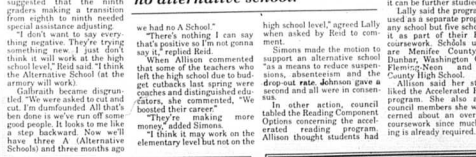
Eugene Kelley, right, received both the four-year perfect attendance award and his 15 years of service award from Carlisle Mayor Ronnie Clark.



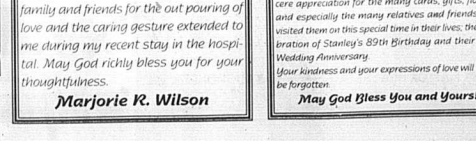
Lamar Mann, right, received his 20-year service award from Mayor Ronnie Clark.

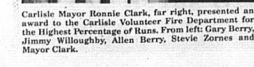
