Administrators from surrounding districts will help tabulate questionnaires. Moore said he wants to hear what people think about the elementary school, not just the system itself.

Repiles to the survey/audit will be kept confidential with Moore giving the results to report at the end of the project. In this project, we'll do a needs assessment and to students to do well on test scores. They need to have the importance of the tests in their future explained to them. They need to have rewards - even pizza and ice cream. Moore said.

Moore said he will ask teachers to teach more core curriculum. English, math, social studies and science. As far as Arts and Humanities, students may be asked to their education but learn art, they could learn about artists and the history of the work.
