## Carleile's Dr. Rinaldini arranges kidney injections

A Carleile patient's health and sense of well-being was improved over the past few months when a physician, Dr. Ana Rinaldini, was able to provide a treatment to her which was previously not available in Nicholas County.

Imogene Story, 73, suffers from a recurring kidney problem. This problem is caused by abnormal levels of Creatinine and Hematoctrit in her bloodstream.

The treatment for her problem requires injections of Eupogen three times a week. Eupogen is the level of creatinine and hematoctrit in Mrs. Story's blood and eliminates the need for a blood transfusion. It only takes 10 minutes to receive the injection. The answer to her problem came from Dr. Ana Rinaldini and Johnson-Mathers Health Care.

In search of a more convenient way to get her injections, Imogene Story went to Melanie Denton, Director of Nursing for Nicholas County Hospital. Denton suggested a treatment arrangement with Dr. Ferguson, a urologist in Lexington, KY. Dr. Ana Rinaldini receives her injections from Dr. Ana in Carleile rather than in Lexington.

"The change has made my injections much easier. This has really worked out well. Dr. Ana is really friendly and is taking good care of me. Better than that, my neighbors can get me out to her office a lot easier than having to travel all the way. I really appreciate all that's been done," said Mrs. Story.

## Robertson's volunteer ambulance service receives additional help

The Volunteer Ambulance Service in Mt. Olivet has additional support these days. An Advanced Life Support emergency medical transport company is providing services to Robertson and surrounding counties.

For decades, the Robertson County Life Squad has provided emergency medical support to the residents of Robertson County. This support has been vital for the saving of many lives.

However, according to Robertson County Judge-Executive Wayne Baskin, it was becoming difficult to keep a staff of trained rescue squad staffed during the day. And there were times when patients needed the help of a paramedic. Their life could not have on staff.

The answer to their problem was Advanced Care (ACT) and Training, Inc. (ACTI) an Advanced Life Support ambulance service. When the nearest hospital is 20 minutes away in any direction, it is a benefit that this company can provide advanced emergency care to Robertson and, when needed, surrounding counties. And in the process Robertson County was able to save money.

Most small communities in Nicholas County have a Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulance service. A BLS service is staffed by trained EMT's trained in basic life support services such as CPR, First Aid, and Oxygen Therapy. Their training is
