Canterbury House celebrates first year in business

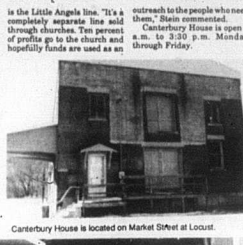

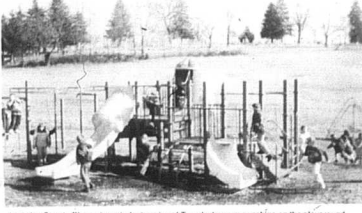
