What I've Done Lately

The following letter is a reply to a letter published in the July 20 edition from Mr. Wilkinson and is the writer's response about the flag issue to be placed on all graves of Nicholas County veterans by both American Legion Post #1 and the Carlisle Veterans Home.

To the Editor: I've got Pvt. Eugene Gates (now deceased) recognized for his D.S.C. (Distinguished Service Cross) Award which went unrecognized for over 50 years here by both clubs.

He received the highest award ever to be awarded to a Nicholas resident.

I got Pvt. George T. Smart Jr. recognized for being awarded the Silver Star and being the first to lose his life from Nicholas County in World War I. He died on Dec. 10, 1942.

I got Pvt. MARY E. Carroll recognized for being the second man killed from Harrison High School in Nicholas County, on Dec. 23, 1942. I learned on a mistake that I had placed on the wrong man.

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
