

Magistrates view Nicholas County Courthouse restoration

In the meantime, Senior Citizen Advisory Council President Betty Frye asked if the hours for work would be changed.

"That's up to the new director," Frye replied.

Magistrate Jessica Smith said the hours of employees could be changed and the budget could be changed with an amendment by the court. Also noted was the lease for the new director.

Available to other county employees, Bowles would be paid \$10 an hour for 30 hours but would have to pay for insurance out of her salary. Frye estimated the insurance at \$1,700.

"I can't see it for one and for all of them. If we can go along with that," County Judge Executive Chuck Smith commented.

Bowles should begin her new career on Thursday if she accepts the position.

In other action, the court heard Jack McDrew of General Restoration comment on the courthouse renovation. "People in a small town are interested. They take pictures and ask intelligent questions. In a larger city they wouldn't even know where their courthouse was."

Also at the meeting, Betty Alpert informed magistrates she had a job and could no longer transport her 13-year-old daughter to school. Alpert lives at 2153 1/2 mile up Old House Creek, off Chazy Creek, Mersebrook Good Farm, washes out school buses and school buses can't travel there. She had three pipes and offered to use county equipment to make a ditch, but was informed she couldn't borrow county equipment.

Magistrates agreed the road was a county road and agreed to look at the situation. Stacy said the road wasn't in his district, but noted many county roads needed work. He said magistrates could make a decision on a specific time.
