Vaccine regulations explained

FRANKFORT Changes in vaccine regulations for children starting this year give school or school officials full surprise. Parents who aren't kept up with these requirements.

Up-to-date immunization certificates, including additional shots, and medical exams are required for children to enroll in these facilities, health officials warn.

State regulations now require that children receive measles, mumps, rubella (MMR), diphtheria tetanus pertussis (DTP) or DTPa, polio, Haemophilus influenzae type b, and hepatitis B vaccines as recommended for their age before they attend day care, pre-school, school or other facilities that care for children in Kentucky.

A statute passed by the 1996 General Assembly added mumps, Haemophilus influenzae b, and hepatitis B to the list of required immunizations.

State regulations also require that children receive a second dose measles vaccine before entering school.

The new requirements are in effect now, except for hepatitis B, which takes effect in 1998 and applies to children born on or after Oct. 1, 1992.

Children must have a proof they have received a tuberculin skin test within 18 months prior to enrollment in school.

Getting all these vaccines prior to school, said Rose Leavel, M.D., commissioner of the Kentucky Department for Public Health. They step out mumps diseases that are a nuisance to everyone and fatal to some.

Most childhood immunizations should be done by a child's second birthday.

By entry into sixth grade Kentucky children must have a valid immunization certificate that shows two MMR vaccines and physical exam within one year of beginning with grade.

The changes may be confusing to parents, so if you have questions about your child's immunizations, you should talk to your doctor or your local health department, said Charles Palmer, M.D., communicable disease branch manager in the Department of Health.

Parents needing shots. TB skin tests and physical exams for their children should contact their private physician or local health department for an appointment as soon as possible, because school enrollment is just around the corner. These health professionals can also provide parents with the certificates necessary for school enrollment.

Palmer stressed that children must receive the full series of shots to be fully immunized.

Most childhood immunizations should be done by a child's second birthday, but school, preschool or child care enrollment is the first opportunity for state officials to enforce it.

Parents sometimes begin the immunizations on schedule but do not complete them and that leaves children vulnerable to serious, life-threatening diseases, he said.
