"When will he see the hat?" Young asked School Board Attorney Dawn Letcher.

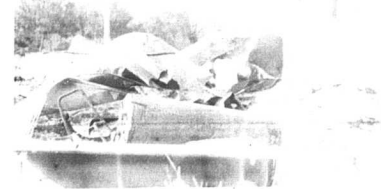
None of the board members admitted they were stating "no comment" due to advice from an attorney.

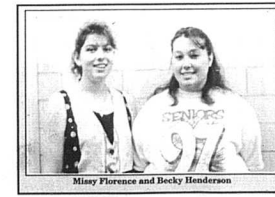
